#### From the Pastors:

AUGUST, 2019

"Do not be daunted by the enormity of the world's grief.
Do justly now. Love mercy now. Walk humbly now.
You are not obligated to complete the work,
but neither are you free to abandon it." —from the Talmud

Our family was blessed to go to Washington, DC for our family vacation, and we experienced so much. We were able to honor a Supreme Court justice lying in state. We were able visit the gallery of the Senate. We visited so many sites that we had only read about in books.

But the thing that we appreciated most was the connection with the history of our country and the world. This was seen in the halls of the capitol, and in every monument and memorial. And in the many, many hours we spent in museums—reading, studying, learning, and growing.

While all of the museums were interesting, and some very fun, the museum that was hardest to walk through was the Holocaust Museum. The images, the pictures, the history in that museum cannot be captured in words. And yet here is what we all talked about when we left that place: the deafening silence of the world to the tragedy of the Holocaust. Speaking out could have changed everything, but six million people died because no one would speak up.

We need to talk about that part of our history, because we need to remember that evil exists. Evil can happen, but we can change it. We need to be the voice of Jesus in this world, to speak out on behalf of those who are suffering, those who are oppressed, on behalf of all those who are living in poverty, in fear, and in danger.

Jesus said, "Whatever you do to the least of these, you do unto me." One thing we will remember from this museum: That we are the hands and the feet and the voice and the heart of Jesus, and we need to use those things to make a difference in the world. We need to not let events like the Holocaust happen ever again. We need to speak out. We need to help. We need to work together to change the world. "Whatever you do to the least of these, you do onto me."

The time to act is now. Let us never tire of doing what is right.


