WELCA THANKOFFERING

Our annual Thankoffering service will be in November. All women are encouraged to give an offering in grateful appreciation for all the blessings we have received. If you would like to set aside an offering during the year for blessings you receive or things you are thankful for, containers are available on the table in the narthex.

Beginning in the late 19th century, Lutheran women were given small Thankoffering boxes to place in a special location in their homes as a visible reminder of blessings received. From their use came the idea of an annual church service to celebrate their collection. The first Thankoffering service was created by the General Synod's Women's Home and Foreign Ministry Service in 1889 in celebration of their 10th anniversary. At that time %6,100 was collected. Today Women of the ELCA collect more than \$1 million in Thankofferings annually for the ministries and mission of our women's organization.

It is a tradition grounded in our celebration of community and of meeting together to joyfully give thanks for what God has given


Valentine Care Boxes

Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits

During March we will be collecting items for personal care kits to be sent to Lutheran World Relief in April.

When families find their homes destroyed or must flee for their safety and arrive in a refugee camp or other safe place, simple items included in a personal care kit provide self-care, germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity in a time of uncertainty. The following items are needed for a personal care kit:

One light-weight bath towel, dark color Two to three bars of wrapped soap equaling 8-9 oz. One wide-tooth comb (remove packaging) One metal nail clippers (remove packaging)

Any items that are donated are much appreciated. If a family would like to provide a personal care package, all the above items can be wrapped in the towel and tied with yarn or ribbon.

There will be a bin inside the gym door for any items that ou would like to leave at the church. Donations can also be put in the brown baskets in the narthex.
